However, in the case of intransitives, these types of verbs are not related to objects. For example, in the sentence She slept all day, the verb sleeping does not match any kind of object. (I) Recommendation Recs Transitive verbs are verbs with objects. An intransitive verb is a verb that has no object. Mentions whether the verb in the next sentence is transitive or intransitive. Here the verb has an object (I), so it is transitive. Here the verb has an object (cousin), so it is transitive. Verbs do not have objects here, so they are auto-processed.
